A. Description of Project

The goal of the project is to apply the theories and techniques learned this semester. The student will demonstrate their skills by creating two artworks. The content of the work is left to the student's imagination yet must be appropriate for presentation and respect the moral tone of the school and the teaching of our Catholic faith.

Both works must reflect a theme. The theme is left to the student's discretion. Included with the artwork will be a one page statement regarding the theme. Within this statement, the student will identify the theme and rationalize why it was important for them to explore this theme in their artwork and why the student feels that the selected medium was the ideal medium to express the subject/design (you must make connections to your learning and personal experiences). Review the rubric to ensure that expectations are met.

The reflection must be submitted as a hard copy along with the artworks on the submission date.

B. Format

Artwork:

size: Artwork must not be smaller than 11x17 inches

surface: Students may choose to work on the surface of their choice (paper, Bristol board,

canvas, etc.)

medium: Students may choose to work with the medium (paint, pastel, crayons, charcoal, etc.) of

their choice but must do so by applying techniques learned this semester and/or previous semesters (ie: finger painting was not a technique covered and should not be

practised for this assignment)

Reflection:

length: 1 page, double-spaced, 12pt font (Times or Arial)

specifications: Title page must be included

C. Expectations and Submission

The cumulative assignment for this course is an independent study unit and should be completed during the student's own time (this may include down time between class projects). In regards to the written statement, the student may bring the written component of the assignment home to properly research, reflect, compose and write their statement. The cumulative assignment must be completed and submitted by June 15, 2020.
