New Initiatives:

There is funding available for the creation of Family Support Networks. The deadline for applications was April 16th, 2018.

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There has been much discussion about some of the changes to the passport funding as Bill C148 has triggered some additional steps for families and agencies. For example, registering every worker, paying workers for stats to name a few.

There is a new Minister of Community of Social Services, Michael Coteau. As well, there are some interesting and exciting plans for the Developmental Services Sector; an increase to passport funding, an earlier availability to passport funding, an increase of residential opportunities to name a few. These proposed changes would be part of a three year plan as explained in the 2018 provincial budget.

Other Information:

The supervisor overseeing the Transitional Support Services is now Leigh Ann Giardino. I will be continuing on as SEAC representative for the agency.

- Key Worker for remaining portion of school board is currently being interviewed by Citizen Advocacy.

Other Information:

Bill 191 has been resurrected as Bill 44. Still hope of passing before the writ drop. Lots of closed door stuff happening.

FASD Awareness Day was a huge success. First time in history, the province FASD reps from all five regions and all directly impacted sectors physically came together in one place. We met with over 35 MPP's. MPP Kiwala's statement was we are the best organized advocacy group she has ever worked with. Kids had MPP Taylor just roaring with laughter and were fabulous the entire time. They got to watch Bill 44 pass first reading.

September initiatives are still being discussed at the MCYS policy level.

The Rural FASD Support Network has launched with a pamphlet, website and closed Facebook group. It is the caregiver portion of the LLG FASD Work Group and modeled after the Halton model.

IV. Department Update

The April 27th Professional Activity Day agenda was sent to SEAC, CSC and PIC members and they were invited and are welcome to attend. The Special Education Team has been working on the sessions to prepare for the day. We will be showcasing strategies that are "Essential For Some But Good For All". The new Mathematical Learning for All magazine will be shared with all participants.

Dr. Hawes shared some funding information. The Ministry of Education will be providing additional funds for mental health and addictions. Staffing will be increased to include two health regulated professionals. The focus will be on high school students.

Additional staff will be hired to address the waitlist for assessments. In addition, the Special Incident Portion has increased to \$38,000 for the maximum amount.

Dr. Hawes shared the Program and Service Model from the annual report with SEAC.

Correspondence was shared regarding the New Brunswick review strategy.
