SRT Reflection:

I have been reading many professional articles about online teaching and learning and the technical aspects of the software we are using, most of these online. At the end of March break I started reading the 4th book in the Miss Peregrine's Series: *Map of Days*. Although I enjoy this book I have been progressing very slowly because of my professional reading and because I am also reading a nonfiction book. On April 2, we welcomed a new puppy to our home. To help our family be good dog parents, I am re-reading *The Art of Raising a Puppy by the Munks of New Skete*; a book I read many years ago when I adopted my first dog with my husband.
